

INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE

TERMS OF REFERENCE KEY PRINCIPLES & ELEMENTS

That the International Committee is responsible for developing, co-ordinating, implementing and evaluating all aspects of the FPH international programme, activities and work. The Committee advises the FPH Board and takes actions on behalf of the FPH in international affairs. This will include, but is not limited to:

- Advising on the Faculty's bilateral and multilateral relations and collaborations with other organisations and institutions;
- Establishing, maintaining and strengthening the Faculty's international partnerships and strategic alliances;
- Developing and implementing policies and activities to support international or comparative policy development, education and training or research, including international agreements, MOUs, affiliations, subscriptions and networking events (conferences, workshops and seminars);
- Advising other Faculty departments and committees on how the international element of their work might be best advanced;
- Developing, implementing and keeping under review the Faculty's International Strategy;
- Developing and implementing regional and country programmes, plans and activities;
- Providing a forum for the development and exchange of good international public health practice;
- Mobilising the Faculty's membership to support and contribute to the development and implementation of the organisation's International Strategy;
- Promoting the Faculty internationally as well as ensuring and overseeing the Faculty's membership of and representative on appropriate international organisations and forums;
- Developing appropriate programmes for the conduct of overseas policy;
- Leading and managing the conduct of negotiations with overseas organisations and other institutions for such other forms of international collaboration as may promote the objects of the Faculty and the interests of its members;

Accountability & Reporting

The International Committee reports to the FPH Board through the Executive Committee. It is a standing committee of the Board and meets four times a year.
