



Wilfrid Harding Faculty Prize

Establishment

Foundation

This Prize was created in 1990 by Dr Wilfrid and Mrs Hilary Harding to recognise members who have made a significant contribution to FPH. This prize, which is awarded every two years, is aimed at FPH members who volunteer their time to do things like: developing the public health curriculum, delivering the public health exams, getting involved in further education services like events and workshops. This list isn't exhaustive though – we know a huge amount of our members work tirelessly on our behalf across a plethora of activities so if this is you or someone you know, please consider applying.

Funding

This award will be funded by the Wilfrid Harding Faculty Prize Fund. The Wilfrid Harding Faculty Prize Fund is open for funding from alternative sources such as future donations and legacy commitments if need be.

Regulations

Purpose

To recognise members who have made a significant contribution to FPH.

Eligibility

Any Member or Fellow of FPH who is currently in good standing can nominate themselves, or be nominated, for this Prize.

Prize

A certificate and cheque for £150.

Nomination

Nominations can be made by regional/country committees, Faculty standing committees and individual members of the Faculty. If more than one nomination is submitted these should be placed in priority order.



Citations should consist of a one page curriculum vitae and reasons for the proposal (about half a page of A4) and should be signed by 2 members of the Faculty of Public Health. Nominations should be sent to membership@fph.org.uk by 31 March 2020.

Frequency of award

The award is given annually, funds permitting.

Closing date

31 March 2020.

Adjudication

Adjudication to be undertaken by the FPH President and Registrar.

Criteria for award

The award will be presented to one winner each year.

Presentation

This will be presented at the annual awards ceremony.

Announcement

The decision of the President will be reported to the Board and announced at the annual awards presentation.

What opportunities are there to promote the award or prize winner?

Celebrating the achievements of FPH members is really important to us. That's why we encourage all award and prize winners to write a blog for us giving a brief account of the work you undertook to receive the award.
