Wilfrid Harding Faculty Prize Regulations

Foundation

This prize was created in 1990 by Dr Wilfrid and Mrs Hilary Harding to recognise FPH members who have made a significant contribution to FPH. The prize, which is awarded every two years, is aimed at members who volunteer their time to do things like: developing the public health curriculum, delivering the public health exams, and getting involved in further education services like events and workshops. This list isn't exhaustive though – we know a huge amount of our members work tirelessly on our behalf across a plethora of activities so if this is you or someone you know, please consider applying.

Funding

The prize is funded by the Wilfrid Harding Faculty Prize Fund. The Wilfrid Harding Faculty Prize Fund is open for funding from alternative sources such as future donations and legacy commitments if need be.

Purpose

To recognise members who have made a significant contribution to FPH.

Eligibility

Any Member or Fellow of FPH who is currently in good standing can nominate themselves, or be nominated, for this prize.

Prize

A certificate and cheque for £150.

Nomination

Nominations can be made by regional/country committees, standing committees and individual members of the Faculty. If more than one nomination is submitted these should be placed in priority order.

Citations should consist of a one-page CV and reasons for the proposal (about half a page of A4) and should be signed by two members of the Faculty of Public Health. Nominations should be sent to <u>membership@fph.org.uk</u>.

Frequency of prize

The prize is awarded every two years, funds permitting.
