



## NATIONALLY AVAILABLE TRAINING PLACEMENTS

'Nationally Available Training Placements' (NATP) offer Public Health Specialty Registrars (StRs) opportunities to acquire specific additional or contextual experience at a national level and develop specialist leadership knowledge and skills.

These placements will be listed on the Faculty website to signpost registrars to these organisations. Local deanery processes for approving a registrar's request to undertake these placements apply.

The Faculty of Public Health will add placements to the list which will meet the following criteria.

**Criteria:**

The placement must offer unique training opportunities that are not available locally.

It must be a GMC-approved placement.

The host organisation must approve the placement.

The application must be supported by the local Head of School / Training Programme Director.

The placement must be advertised to all registrars nationally, with a fair selection process.

The team provides public health input and support to programmes across NHS England and DHSC. This provides opportunities in a wide range of areas, including digital products and services, healthcare public health, health informatics, health inequalities and inclusion health, health protection and prevention, and behavioural science. The team also has a Consultant embedded with Queen Mary's University, with potential for academic public health projects.

The team regularly hosts PH registrars, GP registrars and clinical fellows, creating a positive learning environment. Recent projects have included:

- Development and publication of ICB commissioning guidance for outbreak response
- Development and leadership of workstreams for the Modern Service Frameworks for cardiovascular disease and severe mental illness
- Policy development and case study collation for the National Neighbourhood Health Implementation Programme
- Reviewing the impact of the Infected Blood Inquiry on demand for hepatitis C testing
- Development of a population health resource to support proactive prevention and management for patients at high risk of hospital admission during winter

**EQUAL ACCESS ARRANGEMENTS** (Please explain how you would ensure this placement is accessible to all suitable trainees across the UK)

The team works in a hybrid way creating access opportunities for Registrars across the country. NHS England has an expectation for 40% of time to be in an NHSE office, with the team using both London and Leeds bases. Relocation and travel expenses should be negotiated with the registrar's home deanery. Reasonable adjustments can be discussed to support access.

The team works across the three domains of public health with a particular emphasis on healthcare public health and can supervise projects across all aspects of public health, subject to team and organisational priorities. Examples of potential projects include:

- Lead the public health contribution to the development of upcoming Modern Service Frameworks
- Develop a national implementation and evaluation framework for ICB commissioning of clinical outbreak response activities
- Lead the development and testing of a population health analytics approach to identify patients at high risk of winter hospital admission
- Analyse the public health opportunities of the National Neighbourhood Health Implementation Programme and implications for local systems
- Use population health medicine techniques to identify those at risk of falling out of work, and develop evaluation tools to assess the effectiveness of interventions
